
The 21st Century Learners Oracy Hub for schools in Stoke, Staffordshire and Cheshire.





Our training providers

The hub is led by Dr Neil Phillipson, who works closely with:

- SAPERE the charity largely responsible for Philosophy for Children (P4C) practice in the UK
- Dialogue Works (run by Roger Sutcliffe and offering training in Thinking Moves A-Z – metacognition made simple)
- Oracy Cambridge (run by Professor Neil Mercer and a leading provider of oracy training across the UK and internationally)

Neil co-authored the book 'Dialogic Education' with Professor Rupert Wegerif, and is a lead-mentor with Keele and North Staffordshire Teacher Education. The 21st Century Learners Oracy Hub has been established in partnership with Southstar Education and Training to build on the existing good practice of schools in Stoke-on-Trent, Staffordshire and Cheshire by enabling access to high quality professional development from nationally recognised providers. We hope that by working together we will be able to minimise costs to individual schools and provide more ambitious professional development programmes than might otherwise be manageable.

DIALOGUE

The hub is able to offer comprehensive support for the development of oracy practice. This includes:

- Full training and support for the SAPERE P4C training pathway and School Awards Scheme
- Training and support in Thinking Moves A-Z from Dialogue Works
- Oracy Cambridge training and programmes of support (these range from ¹/₂ day introductions to Oracy to years-long programmes of training and support across multiple collaborating schools)

What is Philosophy for Children (P4C)?

P4C is practiced in approximately 60 countries worldwide. It engages children in **communities of enquiry**, which involve philosophical thinking and **dialogue** around questions and **concepts** that are important in their lives and in the subjects they study. This enriches the children's understanding of these concepts and supports them to engage in better dialogue, supporting their well-being and their capacity to learn.

Getting better at dialogue means getting better at 'thinking together', which ultimately leads to better personal thinking and greater wisdom. The skills and dispositions practised in P4C (by teachers as well as students) spread out **across the curriculum**, leading to a better quality of classroom talk and accelerated progress. Available support includes taster sessions, SAPERE training at Levels 1, 2 and 3, and in-school support including working towards SAPERE's School Awards. A '**Pupil P4C Leaders**' course is also available, with training delivered directly to young people.

What is Thinking Moves A-Z (and how does it support metacognition)?

The A-Z is a list of 26 distinct acts of thinking. A, for example, denotes the act of thinking 'Ahead', B the act of thinking 'Back' and C the act of 'Connecting'. The A-Z is:

- Memorable The alphabet acts as a mnemonic making it easy to learn the names of the 26 moves
- Comprehensible Activities and associated language are provided to allow each move to be practised and understood
- Comprehensive All cognitive moves are encompassed in the A-Z. They are applicable across all areas of the curriculum and all phases from early years to secondary.

If we can recognise and name the cognitive moves we make then we can reflect on their purpose and value. We can then begin to make conscious decisions to apply them. We become better at **metacognition**, leading to better thinking, better learning and wiser decisions – a better way of being! The Moves also support **better questioning** for teachers, and richer **classroom dialogue**. You can find out more at <u>thinking-moves.com</u> and <u>21stcenturylearners.org.uk</u>.

What support is available through Oracy Cambridge (oracycambridge.org)
