The Group will meet at least termly and minutes will be taken by someone nominated for the purpose from the Group.

The Group has no delegated powers, other than the power to temporarily second in suitable experts as noted above, and to establish working parties; but has key responsibilities in advising and making strategic policy recommendations in-line with the Trust's Strategic Development Plan to The Executive Board and Directors' Board, and in overseeing the implementation plans and work of the working parties. The Group's remit is:

1. To facilitate and have oversight of the implementation of strategy 4 as outlined in the Strategic Development Plan. To ensure:
Ensure that each setting has a rich, inspiring and highly stimulating curriculum, including extracurricular provision that fully meets the needs of all pupils and leaves them with highly memorable and influential experiences, and overcomes some of the barriers to cementing a broader community and a corporate understanding. This is to be achieved, in part, through the Shakespeare, Music, PE and Ceramics Projects and the work of the Really Useful Generation Students' Group (RUGS);
2. To monitor and evaluate the impact of implementation across the Trust;
3. To make recommendations on the sharing of best practice and the identification of CPD needs.
