

## Improving Our Buildings and Grounds

Each year, we can bid for capital funding from the Government's Condition Improvement Fund (CIF) to improve our buildings and grounds. We have been very successful over the last few years.

Ellison Primary Academy received approx. £400k additional funding over two years to replace their ancient heating system.

Summerbank Primary Academy has had a new entrance to the building due to receiving an additional £170k as a result of their successful bid.





Goldenhill Primary Academy received an additional £155k to improve the entrance, also adding additional meeting rooms and toilet facilities.







## This year we have also:

- Provided the necessary funds to all of our settings for staff training, enrichment opportunities for children and other collaborative projects;
- Benefited from further significant savings through joint procurement projects;
- Provided a wide range of training and coaching to our leaders and governors, including access to the National College Training Hub and School Bus;
- Completed safeguarding and financial audits with flying colours – well done to our Central Team, Headteachers, Business Managers and staff!
- Provided a Wellbeing Day for all staff across the Trust;
- Provided network and mentor support for Early Career Teachers, Subject Leaders, Academy Business Managers and Headteachers new to the Trust;
- Moderated and quality assured standards across the Trust using internal and external support;
- Engaged in Multi-Academy Trust networks as part of our self-review and evaluation practices, and staff professional development;
- Introduced a Cycle to Work Scheme for all staff;
- Successfully moved all our settings onto a Cloud based finance and budgeting solution and Management Information System (MIS).
